The Top 20 List

- 1) Durable: Long lasting, with a 'long shelf life', resistant.
- 2) Robust: Tough, strong, sturdy, solid, hard-wearing.
- **3) Fashionable:** 'In fashion', trendy, cool, up to the minute, à la mode the opposite of untrendy, dated.
- **4) Classic:** Timeless. A product that is as popular today as it was 50 years ago.
- 5) Stylish: Elegant, chic, always cool/fashionable!
- **6) Well-made:** Well-built, well-designed, well-constructed, high quality.
- **7) Eco-friendly:** Green, sustainable also speaks of durability, good for the planet.
- 8) Delicate: Fragile, breakable, in some contexts subtle.
- **9) Flimsy:** Poor quality, insubstantial, breakable. The negative equivalent of fragile.



- **10) Multi-purpose:** Multi-functional, many uses.
- 11) Adaptable: Flexible, adjustable, malleable.
- **12) Exclusive:** Upmarket, similar to 'niche', which highlights the small market segment for a product.
- **13) Inexpensive:** Cheap is similar but with a sometimes negative connation.
- **14) Value for money.** It might be expensive but still represents money well spent. 'A bargain' a great offer.
- **15) Economical:** Low cost, efficient to run/maintain.
- **16) Reliable:** Dependable, tried and tested, sound. It does not break down. Opposite dodgy!
- **17) Dull:** Lifeless, featureless, uninspiring, soulless, bland, boring, tedious.
- **18) Sophisticated:** Refined, suave, cultured, urbane.
- 19) Practical: Useful, functional, sensible.
- **20) Intricate:** Elaborate, ornate, detailed. The negative equivalent is fiddly, or overly complicated.
